# Community Centre



***The Community Centre has been freshened up ready with 50 shades of green, and we can't wait to welcome everyone back on Monday 6th July! Limited activities will recommence under the proviso that we don't have a second wave of COVID-19. If there is an outbreak of COVID-19 on the Central Coast, activities will need to cease.***

We have calculated the maximum number of people allowed in each room to comply with the 4 square metre rule. Signs are on the doors of each room

Bookings will be necessary for all Community Centre activities. We ask that residents bring their own equipment (e.g. bowls, darts, art supplies).

Prior to entry all residents and visitors will be required to:

- **Sign into the Community centre and provide contact details to assist with Contract Tracing**
- **Answer the COVID-19 screening questions**
- **Sanitise hands upon entry**
- **Have their temperature checked**

## The Workshop

The Workshop will re-open on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Residents wishing to use the workshop will be required to complete the sign in process mentioned above.

Users will also need to sign a key in and out as part of the new process.

The updated workshop rules will be distributed to regular users. A total number of four people will be allowed in the Workshop at a time.

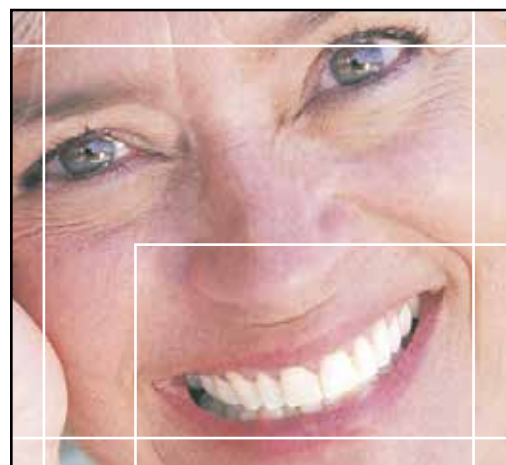

## FLOURLESS ORANGE CAKE

### INGREDIENTS

- Melted salted butter, to grease
- 2 oranges
- 3 eggs
- 215g (1 cup) caster sugar
- 300g (3 cups) almond meal
- 1 teaspoon gluten-free baking powder

### ORANGE SYRUP

- 1 orange
- 155g (3/4 cup) caster sugar

### METHOD

**Step 1** Preheat oven to 170°C. Brush a round 22cm (base measurement) springform pan with melted butter to lightly grease. Line base with non-stick baking paper.

**Step 2** Place the oranges in a saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring to the boil over medium heat. Cook for 15 minutes or until tender. Drain. Return to pan and cover with cold water. Bring to the boil and cook for 15 minutes (this will reduce the bitterness of the peel). Refresh under cold water. Drain. Coarsely chop oranges. Remove and discard any seeds.

**Step 3** Place the orange in the bowl of a food processor and process until smooth.

**Step 4** Use an electric beater to whisk the eggs and sugar in a bowl until thick and pale. Add the orange, almond meal and baking powder and gently fold until just combined. Pour into prepared pan.

**Step 5** Bake for 1 hour or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Set aside for 15 minutes to cool.

**Step 6** Meanwhile, to make the orange syrup, use a zester to remove the rind from the orange. (Alternatively, use a vegetable peeler to peel the rind from orange. Use a small sharp knife to remove white pith. Cut rind into thin strips.) Juice orange.

**Step 7** Place rind in a saucepan of boiling water and cook for 5 minutes or until soft. Drain. Return to pan with orange juice and sugar. Place over low heat and cook, stirring, for 2-3 minutes or until the sugar dissolves and the syrup thickens.

**Step 8** Turn cake onto a serving plate. Use a skewer to gently prick the top. Spoon over syrup. Cut into wedges to serve.

## Avoca Beach Picture Theatre



**Avoca Beach Picture Theatre began in 1948 in the front gardens of brothers Mervyn and Norman Hunter to raise funds to build the Avoca Beach rockpool. The rockpool continues to be a very welcome part of community life.**

Projecting through a hole made in Norman's garage wall onto a homemade screen, people brought cushions to soften the wooden benches.

The candybar was under Mervyn's home and when it rained, everyone tumbled onto the veranda for shelter to continue watching the film!

The brothers decided that a multi-purpose permanent structure was needed, and the Theatre was built. It included the 500 seat cinema, a Commonwealth Bank and a real estate office.

The Theatre operated on Saturdays and during the school holidays, never being open on a Sunday as it was used to hold both Catholic and Presbyterian Church services.

The Theatre adapted as times required, with the inclusion of a Souvenir and Gift Shop from the 60's, Alfresco Screenings on the lawn, a Café from the early '80's and a Wine Bar, all of which continue to this day.

Avoca Beach Picture Theatre is still owned and run by the same family who arrived in Avoca in 1932.
