Due to current Covid-19 restrictions, limited numbers are allowed in the Café (4 people inside and 6 people in the outside garden room).

Please call Reception to book your table and pre-order your meal.

We will have a meal special each day plus your old favourites (toasted sandwiches, salads, coffee, milk shakes etc). The menu is attached.

Coffee will be available for walk-ins provided numbers in the café are not exceeded.

The function room may be used if demand is high to seat additional people.

We believe the café will offer you a safer option than cafes in the community and will advise you shortly on more initiatives that we are working on.

Unfortunately, if the situation in NSW continues to worsen, we may have to close the Community Centre again. We will endeavour to keep the Café operating serving takeaway only.

NSW Public Health Alert

NSW Health have issued a number of public health alerts following a COVID-19 outbreak originating at the Crossroads Hotel in Casula, Sydney. We understand approximately 600 - 1000 patrons were potentially exposed to the virus between the 3rd and 10th July, and NSW Health is undertaking an extensive tracing and testing exercise. So far 40 people have been diagnosed with COVID-19 from this outbreak, and each of these has potentially transmitted the disease to others. If any Village residents or their families have been in the below hotspots, they are unable to enter the Community Centre and should watch for any signs and be tested for COVID-19, no matter how minor the symptoms.

Hotspots include:

Liverpool, Campbelltown, Camden, Wollondilly, Wingecarribee, and Blue Mountains. Specific locations where cases have been identified include:
