Monday to Friday	Visiting Hours	11.00am - 5.30pm
Saturday/Sunday	Visiting Hours	11.00am - 3.00pm

Length of Visits	One (1) hour maximum (exceptions for compassionate reasons only)
Number of Visitors	Maximum of 2 visitors at one time
Children	Children must be strictly supervised (flu vaccination applies)
Location	In room visits only. Video calls or phone calls are encouraged as an alternative

Precautions

- ✓ Disposable or re-usable mask to be worn by all visitors
- ✓ Hand sanitiser on arrival and before touching surfaces
- ✓ Completion of screening questions on entry
- ✓ Temperature reading must be below 37.5 degrees
- ✓ Evidence of flu vaccination e.g. medical certificate or Medicare printout
- ✓ No access to common areas such as the resident lounge or dining rooms
- ✓ Strict physical distancing – remain 1.5 m apart with no physical contact
- ✓ Try to limit your community exposure to the virus prior to visiting

Entry is not permitted if a visitor:

- ✗ Has a fever or symptoms of respiratory illness (e.g. cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath), diarrhoea, other infectious illness or headache
- ✗ Has been diagnosed with COVID-19 (until medical certification of full recovery)
- ✗ Has been in contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19
- ✗ Has been in close contact with or caring for someone who is currently unwell
- ✗ Has returned from overseas in the last 14 days
- ✗ Cannot provide evidence of current flu vaccination
- ✗ Resides, works or has visited a hotspot in the last 14 days

Window Visiting

Window visits are permitted, by prior arrangement with the Facility Manager or the Care Manager.

Resident Outings

- ✓ Strict risk assessment protocols apply to social outings for residents.
- ✓ Medical and essential appointments are permitted with precautions, and risk assessment will determine whether isolation is required on return.
